### "PERSONS ARE GIFTS"

Persons are gifts. Some are wrapped very beautifully, some come in ordinary wrapping paper. Some gifts come loosely wrapped, others very tightly. Some have been mishandled in the mail, others come "Special Delivery."

Whatever the wrapping, we must remember that it is the gift that is important. It is so easy to make this mistake. It is amusing when babies do it; it is heartbreaking when adults do it.

Sometimes the gift is very easy to open. Sometimes I need help. Is it because they are afraid? Does it hurt? Maybe the gift has been opened before and thrown away!

I am a gift. But have I ever really looked inside the wrappings? Am I afraid to? Could it be that there is something else inside the wrappings than what I think there is? Maybe I've never seen the wonderful gift that I am, or accepted the fact that I am a gift, a gift to others. Am I willing to be given to others – a man, a woman for others? Do others have to be content with the wrappings, never permitted to enjoy the gift?

Every meeting of persons is an exchange of gifts. But a gift without a giver is not a gift; it is a thing devoid of a relationship. Friendship is a relationship between persons who see themselves as they are: gifts of the Father to each other for others.

A friend is a gift not just to me, but to others through me. When I keep my friend, possess him, I destroy his "gift-ness." If I save his life for me, I lose it; if I lose it for others, I save it. Persons are gifts, gifts received and gifts given. Friendship is this response.

Wade** decision legalizing the violence of abortion. One ongoing campaign in the diocese that fits within this tradition is an ecumenical effort to encourage gun dealers to voluntarily adhere to a code of conduct designed to minimize the risk that guns will end up in the hands of those who would use them to perpetuate violence.
